Exam requirements

Text count standards

Primary text from the period in question

Primary text can be read either in the original language or in translation. In both cases page count should be based on the original text (if accessible).

- Poetry: 1 standard page = 25 verses
- Prose: 1 standard page = 1550 characters (including spaces)

One standard page read in the text's original language (Greek/Latin/Italian) replaces two standard pages read in modern translation (i.e. a requirement of 400 standard pages of primary literature in modern translation can be substituted by 200 standard pages of primary literature if read in original language).

Secondary text

Page count follows the pagination in the publication.

Monuments

1 monument substitutes 20 pages of primary text in modern translation or 10 standard pages in original language. For each monument special literature in the extend of 50 to 200 pages is required.

In the evaluation, graders assess to what extent the exam paper reflects the academic level of inscription (MA or BA) and more specifically to what extent the student:

- has a good knowledge of the Italian Renaissance
- has a thorough knowledge of the chosen topic
- is able to treat the chosen topic on the basis of original sources (written or material)
- demonstrates ability to view the chosen topic with methods from more disciplines
- critically assesses modern literature on the chosen topic

NB: Prerequisite for all exams mentioned below is attendance and active participation in at least 75% of classes, incl. excursions.

Bachelor level

Maximum 120 pages of primary literature can be substituted by monuments

Exam paper: maximum 12 standard pages, including notes and appendices

Master level

Primary literature: 450 standard pages in modern translation

Monuments: Maximum 200 pages of primary literature can be substituted by monuments

Exam paper: Maximum 15 standard pages, including notes and appendices

Ph.D. level

10 ECTS

Secondary literature: 750 pages

Primary literature: 450 standard pages in modern translation

Monuments: Maximum 200 pages of primary literature can be substituted by monuments
